**BEHAVIOR MEDICINE**

**Dr. Gary Landsberg**

**October 26, 2011**

*Sponsored by Summit Vet Pharm*

Dr. Gary Landsberg graduated from the Ontario Veterinary College in 1976. He is a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Behaviorists, serving as president from 2004-2006. He is also a Diplomate of the European College of Veterinary Behaviorists. He is currently working as a Veterinary Behaviorist at the North Toronto Animal Clinic. He is a frequent speaker on behavioral topics at veterinary conferences around the world. In total, he has authored, co-authored and edited over 100 publications including journal publications and chapters in veterinary texts. He is a Director of Veterinary affairs for Can Cog, a company that investigates and develops new therapeutic agents for brain aging, health and behavior in dogs and cats. He is an adjunct professor at the Ontario Veterinary College, a consultant for the Veterinary Information Network, and is on the scientific advisory board for a number of veterinary companies and veterinary journals.

Dr Landsberg's presentation will include information on; the prevention and treatment of Destructive behavior in dogs and cats; Separation anxiety; Prevention and management of fearful and aggressive patients in the Veterinary Clinic; handling dog aggression on the street; New approaches to Cognitive Dysfunction Syndrome; Drugs and natural therapeutics in veterinary behavior.

**ONCOLOGY**

**Dr. Dennis Macy**

**November 16, 2011**

Dr. Macy is a Diplomate of The American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine (Oncology and Internal Medicine). He is a native Southern Californian and the son of the late Richard Macy, DVM of Whittier, California. He received his DVM from the University of California at Davis and his MS degree from the University of Illinois. Dr. Macy has had a long academic career and has over 150 publications, two United States Patents, and has received international research awards for his contributions to our understanding of vaccine-associated sarcomas in cats. Dr. Macy is past president of the ACVIM specialty of Oncology and he has served on The World Health Organization Committee on Carcinogenesis. In January 2008 he retired from his position as Professor Emeritus at Colorado State University's College of Veterinary and Biomedical Sciences, after more than 30 years of service in order to commit more time to Cancer Care Specialists (a private oncology referral practice he founded in 1990 in Las Vegas, Nevada) and to head the oncology department at Desert Veterinary Specialist in Palm Desert, California. Dr. Macy has two children and enjoys travel and the outdoors.

Dr. Macy will be covering Advances in veterinary clinical oncology from: Recognized causes to the latest diagnostics and treatment of cancer in dogs and cats, including the role of inflammation and mechanism of cancer tumor promotion.

**SOFT TISSUE SURGERY**

**Dr. Howard Seim**

**December 14, 2011**

A 1975 graduate of Washington State University, Dr. Seim completed an Internship at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, Canada, and a two-year surgical residency at the Animal Medical Center in New York City. He has been on the surgical staff at Colorado State University since 1978. He obtained Diplomate status in the American College of Veterinary Surgeons in 1983. Howard was Chief of the Small Animal Surgery section at Colorado State University from 1992 to 2002. He was recipient of the 1993 Merck AGVET Award for Creative Teaching, the Colorado State University N. Preston Davis Award for Instructional Innovation in 1995, and the North American Veterinary Conference's Small Animal Speaker of the Year award in 2009. Dr. Seim authored the neurosurgery section of the text Small Animal Surgery, Fossum editor, Mosby Yearbook, Inc.

Dr. Seim will discuss surgical management of canine and feline calculi; Principles of GI surgery and an interactive case presentation; anal sacculotomy, a novel approach; surgical management of brachycephalic syndrome.

**FELINE MEDICINE**

**Dr. Susan Little, Diplomate ABVP**

**February 8, 2012**

Dr. Susan Little received her BSc from Dalhousie University (Nova Scotia, Canada) in 1983 and her DVM in 1988 from the Ontario Veterinary College, University of Guelph. She has been in feline practice since 1990 and achieved board certification in Feline Practice in 1997, re-certifying in 2006. She is part owner of two feline specialty practices in Ottawa, Canada. She serves on the board of the Winn Feline Foundation and is a feline medicine consultant for the Veterinary Information Network. In 2010, Dr. Little was the recipient of the Canadian Veterinary Medical Assoc. Small Animal Practitioner Award. She is the editor and co-author of a new textbook, *The Cat – Clinical Medicine and Management* – to be published by Elsevier in 2011.

Dr. Little will be discussing diagnosis and treatment of Feline Asthma; Feline Hypertension, Why you should measure blood pressure in cats; Feline Retroviral Testing; Diagnostic Pitfalls; Feline Stomatitis/Gingivitis; How Frustrating is That?; Feline Diabetes—Which Insulin?; Diarrhea in Kittens-Frustrating!

**Dr. Peter Kintzer, DACViM**
